#### SPECIAL NOTES

#### **Livestock Exposition Junior Classic Animal Shows**

Per California State Rules, all animals entered in the Classic Show must be owned by the exhibitor for 30 consecutive days prior to the show. Any animals that have been sold through a junior livestock auction at a California fair are not eligible to be shown in the Classic Show. Animals entered in the Classic Show may not be entered in any other show (ie they may not be entered in a grade or registered breeding division).

#### Livestock Exposition Junior Uniform Requirements

The Junior Livestock Exposition is an open junior show. Exhibitors shall wear jeans (no distressed, stonewashed, rips, tears or excessively worn jeans or shorts) or slacks and shirt/blouse with a collar (i.e. polo type or button down, no tank tops or t-shirts) in the show ring. Whites are also are acceptable. 4-H or FFA Uniforms are not allowed unless specifically allowed within department rules.

#### Stalling/Penning

If you wish to be penned/stalled with another exhibitor, a Stall Request Form MUST be filled out and returned to us. **NOTES PUT IN THE ONLINE ENTRY SYSTEM WILL NOT PRINT OUT ON OUR STALLING REPORTS.** 

#### Still Exhibits

This year's show will offer an expanded still exhibit department for both junior and open exhibitors.

#### **Bedding**

Either shavings or straw may be used. **NO FREE BEDDING WILL BE PROVIDED THIS YEAR.** There will be a vendor onsite. Please check our website closer to the show for hours and details on the availability of pre orders.

#### **Entries**

All entries must be completed online. The online entry link will be posted on our website at <a href="www.grandnationalrodeo.com">www.grandnationalrodeo.com</a>. The entry link will be live on or around September 1. Upon completion of entries, exhibitors must print out and submit the online entry release form to the Cow Palace via mail or fax. Do not submit copies of your online entry confirmation with your exhibitor information sheets. Keep the copy for your records and as proof of entry.

Junior exhibitors may enter in the open show, if offered, as long as the same animals are also entered in the junior show under the exhibitor's name. Failure to enter and show in the junior show will cause the junior to be disqualified from the open show. This only applies to animals and not still exhibits.

#### Late Entries

Entries will close at midnight on Friday, October 2. The late entry period will run from 12:01 am on Saturday, October 3 and close at 11:59 pm on Friday, October 10. The late entry fee will be \$50 per exhibitor. No entries will be accepted after the close of the late entry period. The only exception to this is showmanship. See department rules for additional details.

### SPECIAL NOTES Schedule

We will continue to offer a flexible load in and load out schedule. While exhibitors are encouraged to stay for the duration of the show, we will be issuing releases as soon as possible upon the completion of each show. There will not be an awards ceremony; all awards will be given ringside. However, any exhibitor that qualifies for the Livestock Parade of Champions in the rodeo performance MUST be present for the parade or all awards will be forfeited. See department rules for details.

#### **Rodeo and Barbeque Tickets**

SAVE EVEN MORE MONEY BY PRE-PURCHASING YOUR TICKETS! A PRCA Rodeo will be held on October 16, 17, 23 and 24. A Western Barbeque will be held prior to each performance in the South Hall. Discount tickets may be purchased at the time of entry or in the livestock office during the show. Prices are:

Free panel tie outs will be available in the outdoor arena. The stockyard pens will be auctioned off via an online Breeder's World auction. The auction will be held on September 24. The time and web link will be posted on our website.

#### **Grounds Entrance and Parking**

As in the past, there will be limited Handicapped Parking in the lower bay/barn area. All others will be required to park in the main parking lot and walk down to the barn area. Please plan accordingly. Entrance to the Cow Palace grounds will be through Gate 8 on Martin St. All passes will only be valid at Gate 8.

#### **Stock Trailer Parking**

Stock trailer parking will be in the railroad yard at the corner of Geneva Ave and Bayshore.

#### ENTRY FEES, DEADLINES AND CREDENTIALS

#### **Entry Deadlines-See local rules for specifics**

#### All entries (except Rabbits) must be made using our online entry system.

<u>All entries</u> (except Rabbits) must be made via our online entry system. The system will accept entries until 11:59 PM on Friday, October 2, 2015. NOTE: If you are having difficulties with the site or have technical questions, please e-mail <u>livestock@cowpalace.com</u>.

<u>Late entries</u> will be accepted via our online entry system between Saturday, October 3 and 11:59 PM on Friday, October 9. There will be a \$50 fee per exhibitor for late entries (except for showmanship-see divisions for details). Only showmanship entries will be accepted at the time of check in. No other entries will be accepted after 11:59 PM on Friday, October 9.

<u>Rabbit</u> entries must be postmarked by **Friday**, **October 16**, **2015**. Email entries will be accepted until midnight on Monday, October 19. See department for additional rules and details.

#### PARKING PERMITS - FEE: \$20.00 Presale, \$25.00 on Onsite

Livestock exhibitors are encouraged to pre purchase all parking permits. Permits purchased at the time of entry will be \$20.00 per permit while any onsite purchases will be \$25.00 per permit. The permit is valid from October 14-18 and will allow unlimited in and out privileges through Gate 8. This permit will not be valid at any other gate.

**PRE-PURCHASED PERMITS**: All permits purchased at the time of entry will be mailed to the address provided at the time of entry.

**ON-SITE PURCHASES**: A permit may be purchased at either Gate 8 or the Livestock Office. However, you will need to pay the daily parking fee to park the first day. You are strongly encouraged to prepurchase your pass.

Stock trailers will be allowed to enter the grounds to load or unload livestock but must be moved to the designated trailer parking area immediately following unloading. All vehicles parked in the parking lot **must** have a permit or they will be towed.

### RV SPACES – FEE: \$100.00 PER SPACE NO ELECTRICITY OR WATER WILL BE PROVIDED

Fee includes a permit for the camper/trailer and one (1) tow vehicle from October 14-18, All campers and trailers must have a permit in order to remain overnight on the Cow Palace grounds. Reservations will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. RV spaces may be paid for with entries via the online entry system OR payment may be sent in with an RV Reservation Form. **NEW: The RV lot will be lined. All campers and personal equipment (chairs, carpets, etc) MUST be kept within your space or you will be charged for a second space. Space numbers will be assigned. If you want to be parked with a group, please include that on your RV Reservation form. Spaces will be approximately 14 feet wide.** 

### Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

- Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the following rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle questions and differences thereto or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or pertaining to the Junior Livestock Exposition, Grand National, exhibits and sales. Any exhibitor who violates any state or local rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums.
- 2. All State Rules published by the California Department of Food & Agriculture, Division of Fairs & Expositions are in force for the Junior Grand National and Grand National Stock Show. Copies of the State Rules are available in the livestock office & online at <a href="https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe">www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe</a>.
- 3. There will be no flyers or notices posted or handed out without prior permission of show management. The cost of removing any posters or flyers will be charged to the organization or person listed on the poster or flyer.
- 4. Livestock exhibitors are permitted to display a sign over each exhibit advertising their own herd. Signs must be removed at the request of management.
- 5. Management reserves the right to add, delete, combine or change classes to benefit the show. Management is not responsible for any awards offered by breed associations or sponsors, although every effort will be made to ensure their delivery to the proper exhibitors.
- 6. Any animal without a legible tattoo (when required by registry association, state rules or local rules) will not be eligible for show competition. Show management reserves the right to spot check tattoos. While not all animals will be inspected, a discrepancy or lack of tattoo on an animal selected for inspection will be grounds for disqualification.
- 7. <u>First bedding will not be supplied</u>. All feed and bedding storage must be confined to your assigned area and meet with all California Fire Marshall Regulations. Limited feed and bedding materials will be available for purchase at the show. Watch our website for details on the feed vendor.
- 8. Exhibitors are to keep stall areas neat and clean, keep the spectator walkways clear of all straw, feed, etc., keep any noise to a low volume, and maintain positive and appropriate behavior at all times.
- 9. DUMPING OF ANY STRAW, BEDDING OR MANURE IN THE BREEZEWAY AREA IS PROHIBITED. All stalls and pens must be cleaned by **7:00AM** every morning. Management will retain all premium monies if exhibits are not kept clean and presentable.
- 10. Management will attempt to comply with stall requests submitted in writing (on the form provided) at the time of entry. Please note that notations made on the online entry system will not reach us until after the stall charts have been completed. STALL REQUESTS ARE NOT GUARANTEED.
- 11. No animals will be allowed on the Cow Palace grounds unless they are entered to show or exhibit. Goat exhibitors please see department rules. No Nurse Cows allowed.
- 12. A brand inspection certificate or Bill of Sale must be available for inspection at all times for all cattle. See State Rules for details. The Brand Inspector will be onsite to ensure that proper documentation is in place.
- 13. Exhibitors must have proof of ownership and/or registration papers available at all times.
- 14. Unless otherwise specified, all divisions and classes shall be judged under the American System of judging.
- 15. Premium checks will be mailed after the show. Checks will not be reissued until 30 days after they have been mailed. Checks must be cashed within 90 days of issue to remain valid. **Expired checks will not be replaced.** Lost checks are subject to a \$25.00 fee.
- 16. <a href="PROTESTS">PROTESTS</a> Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of state or local rules. Judge's decision on awards CANNOT be protested. All protests must be presented to the Livestock Exposition Manager in writing within 4 hours of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit (\$200.00 for animal health rule violations), which will be returned if the protest is deemed valid.
- 17. Dogs are not allowed in the barn area. Dogs will be allowed in the RV Parking area.
- 18. Bicycles and scooters are not allowed anywhere on the Cow Palace grounds except in the RV Parking area. Bicycles or scooters found in other areas will be confiscated and will be returned at the end of the show.
- 19. All cattle must be halter broken.

Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

20. Junior show exhibitors must show their own animals unless a written waiver from the Livestock Exposition Manager is obtained. Permission must be requested in writing and, except for emergency circumstances, must be submitted to the Livestock Exposition Manager no later than Wednesday, October 14. The request must include the name of the person who will be showing the animal(s).

Cause for waiver includes, but is not limited to, the following;

- 1. Exhibitor cannot show because of conflict with school sponsored events or activities.
- 2. Exhibitor cannot show because of conflict with another 4-H event, livestock event or fair event.
- 3. Exhibitor is showing multiple species and it is expected that a scheduling conflict may arise.
- 4. Exhibitor has two or more animals in a class. A waiver is not needed in classes that are broke by weight.
- 5. Exhibitor cannot show for a reason deemed by the Stock Show Manager to be substantially unavoidable and not in conflict with generally accepted standards of fairness in the industry.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to obtain a written waiver before allowing any other person to show the exhibitor's animal.

This rule applies only to the junior shows.

Please note: Exhibitors who obtain waivers under this rule will not qualify for CJLA points. Exhibitors are responsible to check with the appropriate association and departments to determine whether a waiver under this rule will be acceptable.

- 21. Exhibitors do not have to be present at the time of weigh in for any shows that require weights. However, exhibitors are responsible for making arrangements for their animal(s) to be weighed. Show management is not responsible for making sure animals are weighed.
- 22. If the weight of an animal being weighed by an official is disputed, the animal will be immediately taken off the scale and the scale will be checked for balance. The animal will be immediately reweighed. At no time can the animal leave the scale area. The second weight will be the official weight.
- 23. All animals must be weighed during the designated weigh in period. Sheep, Goat and Swine exhibitors are responsible for turning their weight cards into the appropriate clerk's table by the designated time.
- 24. If requested by management, exhibitors will be required to display their animals in a parade. Any exhibitor failing to promptly show or parade animals selected by show management will forfeit all or a portion of the premiums previously awarded.
- 25. The number of tie-outs are limited. See the special notes section for details.
- 25. The Grand National Livestock Exposition, in cooperation with the member shows of the North American Livestock Show & Rodeo Manager Association and Rule Infraction Database, reserves the right to refuse entry of any exhibitor who has been barred from any other show on the basis of unethical practices.
- 26. **DRESS** Junior shows at the Livestock Exposition are open junior shows. Exhibitors in junior shows shall wear jeans (no distressed, stonewashed, rips, tears or excessively worn jeans or shorts) or slacks and shirt/blouse with a collar (i.e. polo type or button down, no tank tops or t-shirts) in the show ring. Whites are also are acceptable. No 4-H or FFA Uniforms are permitted. Open Show exhibitors must be neat and clean.

Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

- 27. All junior exhibitors must have their online entry release form signed by their parent or guardian. By submitting an entry and/or signing the online entry release form, exhibitors (open and junior) and parents/guardians agree to the following code of conduct:
  - A. There is NO SMOKING in any State Building; this includes the Main Arena, on the concourse, the lobbies, and all Livestock Barns. "NO SMOKING" signs are posted throughout the buildings. Smoking is permitted outside only.
  - B. Respectable conduct is expected of all exhibitors. Obscene language will not be tolerated.
  - C. There will be no bikes or scooters allowed in the barn area. The only place bikes are allowed is in the RV camping area.
  - D. Gambling in any form is strictly forbidden.
  - E. Drinking of alcoholic beverages by any exhibitor under the age of 21 or the use of drugs will be grounds for immediate suspension from all activities.
  - F. Exhibitors who are reported to Management for neglect or abuse of their animals will be brought before Management for appropriate action.
  - G. Appropriate attire will be required for all activities.
  - H. No exhibitor will be allowed in the barn area between the hours of 10:00 PM and 5:00 AM unless permission is granted by the Livestock Exposition Manager.
  - I. EXHIBITORS WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY AND ALL DAMAGE DONE TO THE FACILITIES OR EQUIPMENT.

ANY VIOLATORS OF THE RULES OF CONDUCT WILL BE BROUGHT BEFORE COW PALACE AND SHOW MANAGEMENT. The appropriate action will be carried out by show management. This action could include, but not be limited to: suspension from show activities, removal/dismissal of exhibitor and exhibitor's animals, withholding of show premiums and awards and possible reports to the Division of Fairs and Expositions.

- 28. By submitting an entry, each exhibitor and his/her parents (if under 18 years of age), hereby release rights to any photo or video taken for publicity purposes.
- 29. <u>LIABILITY</u> All Exhibitors agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Cow Palace, the Junior Grand National Livestock Exposition, the Grand National Livestock Exposition, Horse Show and Rodeo, and the State of California from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is any way connected with participation in the program or even, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Fair. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the Fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the program or event. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.

#### **ANIMAL HEALTH**

30. The Grand National may have a veterinarian and/or veterinarian assistant on grounds that will be in the barn area. The appointed veterinarian and/or veterinarian assistant reserve the right to inspect all animals. Any person officially conducting a health check shall have the right to enter any trailer, pen or tie area to inspect an animal. Any animal found to be in an unsafe, unsightly or unhealthy condition will be quarantined in a designated area. The exhibitor shall remove said animal(s) from Cow Palace grounds within four hours of being quarantined. The Cow Palace Veterinarians' decisions will be final. See State Rules for specific health information and rules.

Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

#### **ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY & QUALITY OF EXHIBIT**

- 31. The Grand National Livestock Exposition is committed to the humane treatment of all animals exhibited. Every possible precaution is taken to insure the animals' safety and well-being. Any exhibitor found using unethical practices or mistreating an animal on the Cow Palace grounds will be immediately dismissed forfeiting all privileges and premiums and will be reported to the proper authorities. Any animal not cleaned or fitted to show as a true representative of the breed it represents shall be disqualified and the judges will not award premiums on such animal.
- 32. Tail fins, or the addition of any hair or hair like substance, or flocking to the animals body, as well as any grooming material that allows color to come off the animal will not be permitted (False tail switches are permitted).
- 33. No foreign substances are to be injected, pumped, drenched or otherwise forced upon any animal. NO DRENCH GUNS MAY BE USED unless under the direct supervision of the Grand National Vet. Violators may face punishment which includes the possibility of expulsion from the Cow Palace grounds and premium money withheld.

#### FIRE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS IN LIVESTOCK/BARN AREAS

- 34. Heat producing appliances, such as space heaters, electric skillets, toasters, coffee makers, hot plates and any other appliances used for cooking purposes, shall not be permitted in any barn or livestock area. Electrical devices in good repair that are properly maintained and used in direct connection with the care of the animals are permitted. All extension cords must be plugged directly into the socket or into a surge protector that is plugged directly into the socket. Multiple extension cords may not be strung together.
- 35. By order of the State Fire Marshall, there will be no smoking within the barn, livestock areas or in any exhibit using sawdust, straw or similar materials on the floor.
- 36. The storage of flammable or combustible liquids or machines containing such shall not be permitted inside any livestock areas.
- 37. Fire hoses, fire extinguishers or other fire equipment shall not be used except in cases of emergency. These shall not be blocked or obstructed at any time.
- 38. The roads around the barns shall be kept clear so that fire apparatus may be able to pass through at any time. Minimum width of these roads shall be 20 feet.

#### **OUTSTANDING BILLS**

39. All bills for veterinary service, feed or any other debts are due and payable during the show. Any exhibitor who does not meet his or her financial obligations will not be allowed to show at any Grand National show until the bills are paid in full.

#### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

- Junior Show Entries are open to all youth from ages 9 to 19 as of JANUARY 1, 2015. Junior Beef Department entries are open to youth from ages 9 to 21 as of JANUARY 1, 2015. Open Show entries are open to anyone. \*\*PLEASE NOTE THIS UPDATE. WE APPOLOGIZE FOR THE TYPO IN THE ORIGINAL POSTING\*\*
- 2. Any junior who exhibits in the open breeding show must also exhibit the same animals in the junior show of that species. Any junior exhibitor who exhibits in the open breeding show without also exhibiting in the youth show will be disqualified from the open show. Animals that are entered in both shows must be entered under the same exhibitor for both shows. Animals may not be entered in both breeding and market (classic) shows.
- 3. All entries (except Rabbits) must be made using our online entry system. Please note that for an entry to be accepted, the entry fee MUST be paid using a credit card through the online system. Any unpaid entries WILL NOT be accepted.

<u>All entries</u> (except Rabbits) must be made via our online entry system. The system will accept entries until 11:59 PM on Friday, October 2, 2015. NOTE: If you are having difficulties with the site or have technical questions, please e-mail <a href="mailto:livestock@cowpalace.com">livestock@cowpalace.com</a>. Any entry that is not paid for by this time will be considered a late entry and will be charged accordingly.

<u>Late entries</u> will be accepted via our online entry system between Saturday, October 2 and 11:59 PM on Friday, October 9. There will be a \$50 per exhibitor late fee. See individual departments for information on showmanship. Entries will not be accepted after 11:59 PM on Friday, October 9. Any entry not paid for as of this time will not be accepted. **NOTE:** If you are having difficulties with the site or have technical questions, please e-mail <a href="livestock@cowpalace.com">livestock@cowpalace.com</a> or call (415) 404-4142.

Rabbit entries must be postmarked by **Friday**, **October 16**, **2015**. Entries must bear an official U.S. Postal Service postmark to ensure acceptance. A metered postmark will not be considered as a valid postmark for entry deadline purposes. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that their entry forms arrive by the applicable entry deadline. The use of return-receipt, proof of mailing, hand-cancellation (postmarking) at the Post Office and overnight guaranteed service are recommended.

<u>Rabbit</u> entries may be e-mailed by midnight on Monday, October 19, 2015. Entries must be paid prior to the start of judging. See Rabbit Show section for details.


- 4. All Exhibitors must complete the Online Entry Release Form and return it to the Grand National Livestock Exposition. The form is available at www.grandnationalrodeo.com.
- 5. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FOLLOWING THE LATE ENTRY PERIOD.** The exception to this rule is showmanship. See departments for specifics. Show management will refuse entries not entered and/or paid for using the online entry system by the published closing date and will do so without prejudice or discrimination.
- 6. The Grand National reserves the right to reject any entry at will.
- 7. The owner listed on the registration paper must match the name of the exhibitor. No breeding partnerships are allowed for junior show entries. Animals entered in both the junior and senior shows must be entered under the same exhibitor in both shows. See State Rules for detailed information on registration requirements.
- 8. Animals entered in pair or group classes must be entered, shown and judged as individuals in the appropriate classes.
- 9. All animals shall be identified by a permanent number (ear tag, tattoo, photo or drawing, or brand required by breed association, ear notching or micro chip) on the animal which matches the number recorded on the entry.
- Agricultural colleges, state and county institutions and schools will be permitted to enter competition, in all classes. Those entries will be subject to the same rules and regulations which apply to regular exhibits.

#### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

Unless otherwise stated, all rules apply to both the Junior and Open shows at the Grand National Livestock Exposition.

- 11. Management reserves the right to limit entries to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination. Under any limitation of entries, acceptance will be based on entry receiving date, except some eligible entries may be accepted to ensure an equitable representation of specie or breed.
- 12. <u>Dairy & Beef Blocking Chutes</u> will be restricted to designated areas, and a chute fee of \$10 per chute must be paid. <u>Milking Stands & Trimming Tables</u> will also be restricted to designated areas and a table fee of \$5 per table must be paid. Tags issued by management must be affixed to all chutes and tables. Chutes and tables must be moved at the request of management.
- 13. Refunds will not be considered for amounts under \$50.00. Please see State Rule II 6 for requirements. Overpayment of entry fees will not be refunded. In the event of a major livestock disease outbreak in the United States, Cow Palace Management will determine a fair and universal system for the refund of any entry fees collected by the exposition. This system will be based on the date of the outbreak, the severity of the outbreak, and the operational costs associated with and undertaken by Cow Palace Management for the Livestock Show. Any approved refunds will be issued within 30 days of the close of the show.
- 14. There will be a \$35.00 fee for checks returned by the bank. Returned checks must be substituted by cash or money order only, accompanied by the \$35.00 fee.
- 15. There is no limitation on the number of animals an exhibitor may enter, unless otherwise specified, but each exhibitor may only receive premiums on 2 entries per class.
- 16. Animals are not to be muzzled while on the fairgrounds. Muzzles will be confiscated and will not be returned.
- 17. Management reserves the right to implement weigh backs in any show where weight is a determining factor for class breaks.
- 18. If an exhibitor has a classic animal that is weight sifted and as a result may not show in an individual class after passing any required vet check, the exhibitor may use this animal for showmanship if and only if this animal is the only animal the exhibitor has brought to the show.
- 19. Any exhibitor who removes his/her entries prior to the official release time will lose all premiums earned at the show.
- Management reserves the right to physically handle any animal on the Cow Palace grounds at their discretion.

- 3. Junior Breeding Beef Exhibitors shall wear jeans (no distressed, stonewashed, rips, tears or excessively worn jeans or shorts) or slacks and shirt/blouse with a collar (i.e. polo type or button down, no tank tops or t-shirts) in the show ring. Whites are also are acceptable.
- 4. LIMIT: No limit on number of entries, but premiums will only be paid on 2 entries per class per exhibitor.

The Grand National Livestock Exposition receives premium support from the American Angus Association for the Junior Angus Show. AAA rules require that all animals be shown by their owner. Any animals not shown by the owner/exhibitor will be disqualified.

The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers, bred and owned heifers, bred and owned bulls, cow/calf pairs and registered Angus steers as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be

used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

Only bred and owned bulls may be counted in the numbers report for premium participation. To be eligible for Association premiums the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium

participation by the Association. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of

ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified

(tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show. Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating

directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the

individual show. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

All females 20 months of age as of the date of the PACE show must have a 60 day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. Exhibitors may be asked to present said verification upon the request of the Show officials or ASA representatives. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the Show site and verify a 60-day pregnancy. Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification of that animal for that specific show.
- Individual animals shown in group classes must have been entered and shown in the appropriate age class.

- 2. All entries must be duly recorded with the American Angus Association. Any animal with a pending or applied for registration will not be eligible to show. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show competition. Show management reserves the right to spot check tattoos. While not all cattle will be inspected, a discrepancy or lack of tattoo on an animal selected for inspection will be grounds for disqualification.
- 3. The original registration certificate for each entry must be verified by show Management no later than 4:00 PM on Thursday, October 15. All original registration certificates must be available for inspection at the time of judging.
- 4. Females may be shown with a calf at side as long as the calf is her natural calf and the calf is registered. Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective classes. Cow/Calf Champions do not compete for Grand Champion Female.
- 5. Only one person at one time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- 6. All animals shown as part of a group class must also be entered and shown in the appropriate individual class.
- 7. Management reserves the right to add, delete, combine or change classes to benefit the show.
- 8. Junior exhibitors may enter in the open show as long as the same animals are also entered in the junior show under the exhibitor's name. Failure to enter animals in the junior show will cause the entries in the open show to be disqualified.

The American Angus Association®, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Mo., will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not

pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head). Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be reidentified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show. Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in. Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring. *Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus* 

Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at <a href="www.angus.org">www.angus.org</a>. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail

switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as

well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

#### North American Limousin Foundation Standard Rules & Regulations

- 1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation.
- All animals must be 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates or purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates.
   Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
- 3. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
- 4. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
- 5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
  - a) Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or other substances; animals may be subject to a white-towel test;
  - b) The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed):
  - c) The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal confirmation;
  - d)Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. That includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.

**Exceptions**: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. The exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

- 6. Bulls over one (1) year must show with a nose-lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.


